SING'THEATRE TRANSFORMS SGH INTO A MASSIVE PERFORMANCE STAGE FOR EVERYONE

The Fifth MusicFest @ SGH Features a Full Day Music Extravaganza



Singapore, 22 May 2017 – Sing'theatre, Singapore's leading musical revue specialist, transforms the Singapore General Hospital (SGH) Campus into a colossal stage with the fifth edition of *MusicFest @ SGH*. In collaboration with SGH, and presented by Novartis, *MusicFest @ SGH* features over 54 hours of live music and dance packed into one day! The full day extravaganza will take place from 10.30am on 26 May 2017, culminating into a high-powered finale concert at 7pm. Part of Sing'theatre's 10th anniversary celebrations, *MusicFest @ SGH* underscores Sing'theatre's commitment to performing for a better society.

Boasting a new theme 'All of SGH's a Stage – Starring everyone', this edition of *MusicFest @ SGH* turns the spotlight on to members of the staff and public at SGH. Over 250 performers – from professional artists and dancers to the SGH Campus' staff choir – will take the stage at seven different locations within the SGH Campus. Patients, staff and visitors are also welcome to participate in singing classes and open mic

sessions organised for the festival.

Singing Doctors and Nurses

Committed to nurturing musical theatre enthusiasts from all walks of life, Sing'theatre collaborated with SGH to set up the first ever SGH Campus Choir. Comprising doctors, nurses and other members of the hospital's staff, the SGH Campus Choir has undergone weekly vocal training conducted by the Sing'theatre Academy since April 2017.

The SGH Campus Choir will make their debut at *MusicFest* @ *SGH* and will perform familiar songs such as *Stand By Me, Home, Chan Mali Chan* and *Fried Rice Paradise*. They will also be part of the exciting line up of performers at the finale concert.

All Music and Dance, All Day

Filling the lobbies with soulful music all around SGH are local performers Cat Ong, LA Benjamin, Leandra Leandra and Peter Diaz, amongst others. Presenting music of various genres and languages, the artists will take the audience down memory lane with a repertoire of familiar and nostalgic tunes. Audience is also welcome to participate in Sing'fling, a series of singing classes, in the morning and sing on stage with music veterans Nathalie Ribette, Peter Diaz and Cat Ong at the open mic sessions in the afternoon.

At the National Heart Centre, dancers from the esteemed Bhaskar's Arts Academy will dazzle patients, staff and visitors with their sharp and rhythmic classic Indian dance routines. Professional dance company Frontier Danceland will engage the audience through agile contemporary dance moves and masterful technique.

Patients in the wards are also in for a treat: renowned local personalities Hossan Leong, Daphne Khoo and Leandra Leandra will bring songs and cheer straight to the bedsides of patients. Hossan Leong, Daphne Khoo and Leandra Leandra – along with other performers – will roam from ward to ward and entertain and interact with patients and their caregivers.

Theatre and television personality Hossan Leong will make an appearance again in the evening as the host of the finale concert. Based around the theme of Singaporean Composers, the finale concert will feature Suhaimi Yusof, Elaine Chan and Lauren Yeo, amongst others, who will belt out familiar numbers that everyone in the audience can sing along to. Held at SGH Deck on 9, the finale concert is set to end the exciting day of activities on a high note.
